Previously he was an Assistant Professor at the Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, BITS Pilani K. K. Birla Goa Campus. He completed his Ph.D. in Indian Philosophy at IIT Bombay, Mumbai. <p>7. The objectives of the Program/activity/event</p>	<p>This talk aimed to familiarize the audience with Indian knowledge systems and their significance. Indian society has a rich cultural heritage of science and technology that can be easily traced back to ancient India's educational institutions, such as the contribution of The Buddhist alchemical Tantra in the area of chemistry. The varied interpretations of Indian knowledge systems have also led to misinterpretations that need clarification at present. To make sense of the vast repository of cultural and Philosophical literature available, a reinterpretation of the same is necessary.</p>
<p>8. Benefit/Key outcomes of the Program/activity/event</p>	<p>The key learnings of the lecture focused on bringing forth, how Buddhism in its later developments mainly, as Vajrayana Buddhism was an amalgamation of Tantra, Yoga, and Shaivism. The Speaker also argued that Buddhism was not essentially different from Hinduism and that this point of view was largely a misinterpretation. The talk also highlighted the rich system of knowledge at Vikramsila and how it was not only a center of philosophical and religious discussions but also had discussions about chemical sciences and the contribution of tantra to the same. Some sources mention dialogues about chemical processes. In all, the system of learning at Vikramsila was liberal and open to discussions beyond Buddhism.</p>

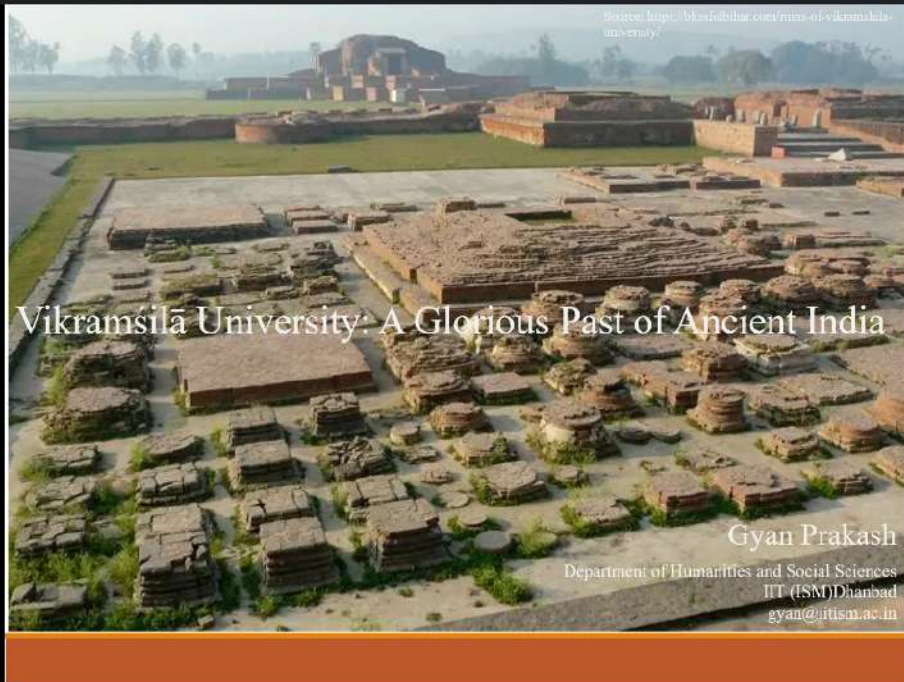
