Borges, Coordinator of the Social Work Programme, who emphasized the importance of integrating forensic science into social work practice to advocate effectively for survivors of sexual violence and child abuse. Day 1 (23rd August 2024): • Presentation by Dr. Sweta Nidhi:

	Drawing on her extensive background in Forensic Biology, Biotechnology, Genomics, Bioinformatics, and Molecular Biology, Dr. Nidhi discussed various forensic tools that social workers can utilize to support legal investigations and strengthen their advocacy efforts.
	She illustrated the application of forensic evidence in social work through real-world examples, demonstrating how DNA analysis,

trace evidence, and digital forensics can play a crucial role in cases of sexual assault and child abuse. Dr. Nidhi also highlighted the importance of understanding the basics of forensic science for social workers, enabling them to collaborate effectively with forensic experts and law enforcement. Her session provided practical insights into the integration of forensic tools in social work, encouraging students to consider forensic science as an essential component of their professional toolkit. Day 2 (26th August 2024): • Presentation bv Adv. Poonam Bharne: "Legal Strategies in Sexual Assault Cases: The Role of Social Workers" Poonam Bharne, the Director of Adv. Prosecution for Goa, shared her expertise on the legal aspects of handling sexual assault cases, focusing on the vital role that social workers play in the justice system. In her presentation, Adv. Bharne outlined the prosecutorial strategies employed in sexual assault cases, emphasizing the need for thorough documentation, evidence collection, and victim support. She discussed the legal frameworks governing sexual assault and child protection, including the POCSO Act, and explained how social workers can aid in navigating these legal processes. Adv. Bharne stressed the importance of social being workers well-versed in legal terminologies and procedures to effectively support survivors and collaborate with legal professionals. Her lecture aimed to empower

social work students with the knowledge and skills needed to advocate for victims' rights and ensure that justice is served.
• Presentation by PI Sudiksha Naik: "Law Enforcement and Social Work: Early Interventions in Sexual Assault Cases"
PI Sudiksha Naik, Police Inspector at the Women Police Station, South Goa, provided valuable insights into the role of law enforcement in sexual assault cases, particularly the importance of early interventions.
Drawing from her extensive experience in handling cases of sexual violence and child protection, PI Naik highlighted the critical need for timely action and coordination between social workers and the police.
She detailed the protocols followed by law enforcement when responding to reports of sexual assault, including the collection of evidence, interviewing victims, and ensuring their safety.
PI Naik emphasized the importance of sensitivity and empathy when dealing with survivors, underscoring the need for social workers to be equipped with skills to provide immediate support and build trust with victims.
PI Naik also discussed the challenges faced by law enforcement in sexual assault cases, such as underreporting and the stigma associated with sexual violence.
She called for a collaborative approach where social workers play a pivotal role in bridging

	the gap between victims and law enforcement, ensuring that survivors receive the necessary support and that justice is pursued diligently. <b>Conclusion</b> The event concluded with an interactive Q&A session, where participants engaged directly with the speakers, asking questions and sharing their thoughts on the topics discussed. The sessions provided a comprehensive understanding of how forensic science and legal frameworks intersect with social work, highlighting the importance of interdisciplinary collaboration in addressing sexual violence and child protection. The lecture series inspired participants to adopt a multidisciplinary approach in their future practice, equipping them with the knowledge and tools needed to advocate effectively for justice and support for survivors.

# Goa University Hosts Lecture Series for Justice and Advocacy

Connecting the Dots: Social Work, Forensic Science, and Legal Interventions in Sexual Assault Cases

PANAJI: The Social Work Programme at Goa University hosted a two-day lecture series titled "Connecting the Dots: Social Work, Forensic Science, and Legal Interventions in Sexual Assault Cases for Justice and Advocacy." Held on the 23rd and 26th of August 2024, the series brought together experts from forensic science, prosecution and law enforcement to provide critical insights into handling cases of sexual violence and child protection, emphasizing the vital role of social workers.

The lecture series aimed to equip social work students and professionals with a comprehensive understanding of how forensic science and legal strategies can be integrated into social work practice to support survivors of sexual violence effectively. By bridging these fields,



the series sought to prepare social workers to collaborate more effectively with forensic experts and legal authorities, ensuring that justice is served and survivors receive the necessary support.

The first day of the series featured Dr. Sweta Nidhi, an Assistant Professor from the National Forensic Sciences University, Goa Campus, who delivered a presentation titled "Unveiling the Science: Forensic Tools for Social Work Practice." Dr. Nidhi discussed the integration of forensic science into social work, focusing on how tools like DNA analysis and digital forensics can support legal cases and advocacy efforts. She emphasized, "Forensic science provides social workers with powerful tools to advocate for survivors of sexual violence. Understanding these tools is essential for ensuring justice and supporting victims through the legal process."

The second day of the series included presentations by Adv. Poonam Bharne, Director of Prosecution, Goa, and PI Sudiksha Naik, Police Inspector at the Women Police Station, South Goa. Adv. Bharne discussed "Legal Strategies in Sexual Assault Cases:

The Role of Social Workers," highlighting the importance of social workers in navigating the legal frameworks and supporting survivors through legal proceedings.

She remarked, "Social workers play a critical role in bridging the gap between survivors and the justice system. Their understanding of legal processes and their ability to provide emotional support are crucial in ensuring that victims' voices are heard and their rights are protected."
