

Benefit/Key outcomes of the Program/activity/event	The participants were acquainted with the significance of a clear understanding of the purvapaksa (already existing view/opponent), which is very important to put forward your view as a philosopher. An overview of the contemporary philosophical ecosystem in India was given. The attendees were introduced to the Idea of creating debates and exploring possibilities of Philosophical discussions in religion, theology, politics etc. The importance of taking into account the development in areas such as literature and sciences was highlighted as Philosophy cannot develop in isolation, of coming up with new philosophical questions rather than looking for questions in the traditional systems.



# Doing Philosophy in Contemporary India

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

## <u>Abstract</u>

Doing philosophy in contemporary India, is necessary to distinguish between doing readily available philosophy and making philosophy ready. Extending the latter by following Nargarjunacharya, Dharmakeerti, and Adi Shankaracharya from India, St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Augustine from the West, it is helpful to identify great ideas in the writings of modern Indian writers and build a philosophical system. In addition, like the Purva paksha in Western and Indian philosophy, identify the immediate Purva Paksha in contemporary Indian philosophy. Critically rallying around the works of Indian social scientists and modern Indian philosophers will provide a broader understanding of the theories in India. It is also helpful to calibrate Indian philosophers with Western philosophers without committing a temporary imbalance. Excavating the neglected yet creative philosophical texts from modern India can enrich the philosophy domain and create philosophical platforms to bring debates on modern Indian thinkers into the discussion, which can bring dynamism to the discipline.
