Description of the Program/activity/event</p>	<p>A day-long educational field visit to a tribal settlement in Morpirla village of Quepem Taluka was jointly organised by the faculty teaching the courses SOC 624: Environment and Society and SOC 625: Indian Tribal Society: Emerging Issues.</p> <p>Morpirla is one of the most picturesque villages in Goa, which is known for its tribal culture. Located in the Quepem constituency, this village is surrounded by mountain ranges. The village of Morpirla is predominantly home to the Velip community, who are committed to preserving their ancestral traditions and maintaining age-old customs.</p> <p>The faculty and students visited the Government High School, Saptkoteswar Temple, followed by <i>Maand, Goankar Gervoi</i> (Clan Deity), <i>Kokanpaik Gervoi, Muth</i>. They engaged with the villagers, observing the daily lives and culture of the Velip community. Additionally, they sought to understand the deep connection between the people and nature in the village.</p>

Benefit/Key outcomes of the Program/activity/event</p>	<p>The visit facilitated students to explore conceptual background for a wide range of topics, such as ecology, environmental conservation, traditional practices, human-nature relationships, and contemporary issues faced by Tribal society.</p> <p>This experiential learning also complemented classroom teachings and enhanced students' insights into the socio-ecological dynamics of tribal groups in Goa.</p>
