10. Objectives of the Event	 To provide social work students with firsthand experience of forensic science in practice. To enhance students' understanding of the role of forensic evidence in child protection and justice. To develop skills in collaborating with forensic experts and understanding the legal frameworks involving children and youth. To foster a multidisciplinary approach to child protection and welfare. 	
11. Description of the Event	The day began with an introductory session at the Goa State Forensic Laboratory, where students received an overview of the role of forensic science in child protection cases. The forensic experts provided insights into how forensic evidence is collected, analyzed and utilized in the investigation of crimes involving children. This session set the stage for the subsequent activities by highlighting the intersection between social work and forensic science.	
	Following the introduction, students participated in a guided tour of the forensic laboratories. They observed demonstrations of various evidence collection and analysis techniques, including those related to cases of child abuse and neglect. The hands-on exposure helped students understand the meticulous processes involved in investigating crimes, emphasizing the importance of accuracy and precision in forensic work. This experience underscored the critical role of forensic science in	

building a case, from the initial collection of evidence to its presentation in court.

In the afternoon, an interactive session was held with forensic experts. The discussions centered around real-life cases involving children, illustrating the pivotal role forensic evidence plays in achieving justice for young victims. The experts shared their experiences in handling sensitive cases, offering students a nuanced understanding of the complexities involved in forensic investigations. The session fostered a multidisciplinary approach, encouraging students to consider how social work practice can complement forensic science in advocating for child protection and justice.

The visit concluded with a question-andanswer session, providing students an opportunity to clarify their understanding of forensic processes related to child protection. The session was highly interactive, with students actively engaging with the forensic experts, seeking guidance on how to apply their learning in social work practice.
