Manuel Gonzalo holds a doctoral degree in economics from UFRJ (Universidade Federal de Rio de Janeiro), Brazil. He has 20 years of experience in doing research, field-work, and teaching on comparative development, innovation and entrepreneurial systems and industrial, STI and international cooperation policy. He was visiting researcher at the Center for Development Studies (CDS), Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), Kerala, India, and at the Research Network on Local Productive and Innovative Systems (Redesist), Economics Institute (IE), UFRJ, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. He assesses Latin American governments, firms, think tanks, and international organisms in building their relationship with India, South Asia, and the Global South Abstract of the Talk: The lecture draws on Dr. Gonzalo's recently published book, "India from Latin America: Peripheralization, State building and Demand-led Growth" (Routledge 2023). The book studies the economic history of India and traces the Indian path of development from a Latin American framework and perspective, contributing to build a common research agenda for the economic development of the Global South.

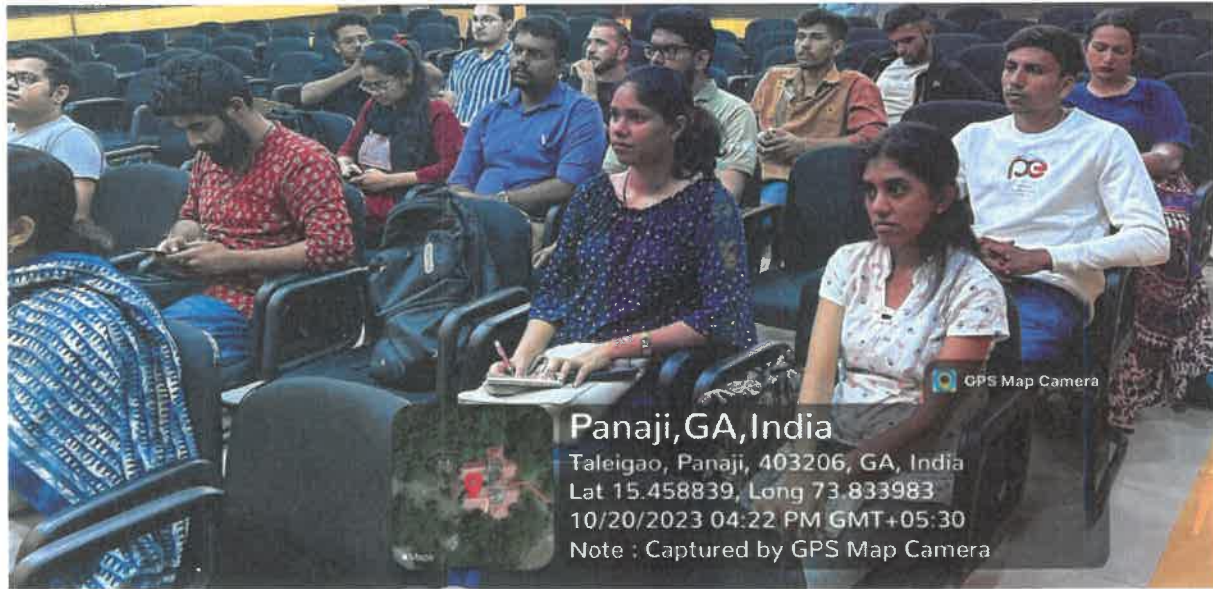
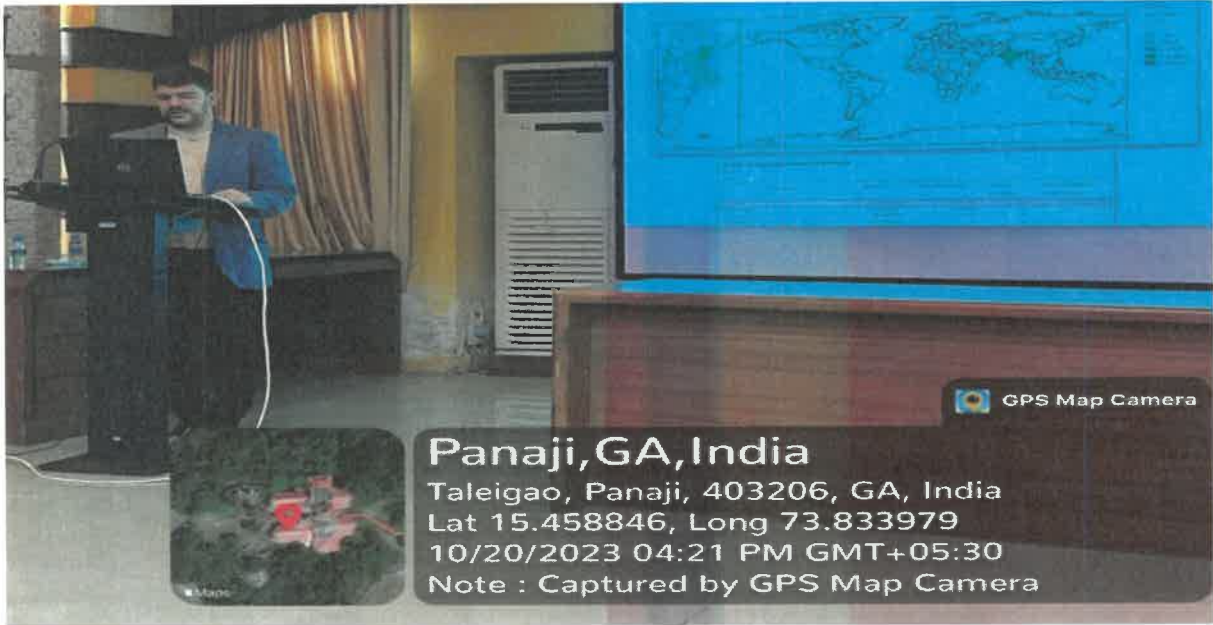
