The objectives of the Program/activity/event	The primary objective of the event was to commemorate India's Independence Day by engaging in a cultural and academic reflection on the themes of freedom, identity, and cultural exchange through the lens of postcolonial literature.
	The event aimed to make students familiar with the topic of Kala Pani writings and the lesser-known narratives of indentured Indian laborers, as captured in postcolonial French literature.

The event, organized on August 14, 2024, featured an enlightening lecture titled "Coolitude Meets Indianité: Postcolonial Kala Pani Writings in French" by the esteemed academic, Prof. Brinda J. Mehta, Germaine Thompson Professor of French and Francophone Studies at Northeastern University, California. The event aimed to reflect on the spirit of freedom and cultural exchange, themes that are deeply intertwined with India's Independence Day.
