6. Detail of the Resource Person (Brief biodata)	Ananya Jahanara Kabir FBA is Professor of English Literature at King's College London. Her research spans creolisation across the Atlantic and Indian Ocean worlds, critical philology, and the relationship between literary texts, embodied cultural expression, and memory work. Professor Kabir is the author of <i>Paradise, Death and Doomsday in Anglo-Saxon Literature</i> (2002), <i>Territory of Desire: Representing the Valley of Kashmir</i> (2009) and <i>Partition's Post-Amnesias: 1947, 1971, and Modern South Asia</i> (2013). During

	<p>2013-18, she directed the ERC Advanced Grant-funded project 'Modern Moves'. She is a Fellow of the British Academy and has been awarded India's Infosys Prize in the Humanities and Germany's Humboldt Research Prize. Professor Kabir is on the editorial team of the new Cambridge University Press journal, Public Humanities. She is a pioneer of embedding impact and public understanding into research through symbiosis with creative producers and non-HEI stakeholders. She conducts her research in English, French, Spanish, Portuguese, Dutch, German, and various Creoles.</p>

10. The objectives of the Program/activity/event	To present a theoretical framework to access literary texts through the proposed theory of creolization and highlight the connected histories of the contact zones of insular and peninsular India, namely Goa and Pondicherry.
11. Description of the Program/activity/event	The resource person proposed a novel approach to evaluate the colonial histories of the contact zones and the enclaves. She focused on the outliers and their connected histories through the convergence and divergence of these island-like enclaves. The session laid a case for transoceanic creolization as a methodology to evaluate literary and cultural productions in this space.
12. Benefit/Key outcomes of the Program/activity/event	They benefitted from a deeper understanding of creolisation as an analytical tool in post-colonial modern studies.
