She elaborated on the challenges faced in prosecution, including gathering evidence, victim support, and delays in the justice system. The session covered key areas such as: • The legal framework of child protection in Goa • Case studies showcasing the prosecution's role in securing justice for children • Best practices in handling cases of child abuse and exploitation • Collaboration between prosecutors, social workers, and law enforcement in ensuring justice

Ensuring Justice for Children: A Prosecutor's Perspective – Dy Director of Prosecution

TALEIGAO: Addressing the complexities of child protection cases in the Children's Court, Mrs. Milena Gomes e Pinto, Deputy Director of Prosecution, provided a comprehensive legal perspective on the challenges and responsibilities of prosecutors in securing justice for child victims.

Speaking at a guest lecture at Goa University's D.D. Kosambi School of Social Sciences and Behavioural Studies, she underscored the critical role of the prosecution in upholding child rights, while emphasizing the need for multi-stakeholder

collaboration in ensuring justice and support for victims.

Highlighting the legal safeguards under the Goa Children's Act, 2003, and the POCSO Act, 2012, Gomes e Pinto noted that while these laws provide a strong legal framework, their effectiveness depends on how cases are handled and the support systems available for child survivors.

She emphasized that prosecutors work within the judicial system to build strong cases, but achieving justice requires coordinated efforts between law enforcement, social workers, and victim support agencies.
