
Report on Re-engaging with poverty measurement: The Rich, The Poor and The Middle class in India

The objective	To reconcile poverty measurements in a rapidly changing economic environment in India.
description of the activity	The program commenced with an opening address by Prof. Christina D'Souza, President of the Alumni Association, followed by the introduction of the Guest Speaker, Dr. William Joe. Dr. William Joe elaborated on the various definitions of poverty proposed by different committees in India. He also discussed the methodologies used to measure absolute and relative poverty, highlighting the essential criteria for an effective poverty measurement approach. Additionally, he emphasized the significance of the new reference poverty line baskets, which should account for rural-urban price differentials, as outlined by the Tendulkar Committee. The webinar underscored the importance of a nuanced understanding of poverty measurement to formulate an effective development strategy.
